EXALTING JESUS

Jesus said, "... I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to Myself."

In English, there are only 3 words (and their derivatives) that begin with the letters **HEAV**... These words are HEAVE, HEAVY, HEAVEN. They all mean "lifted up", usually implying that something, or some effort, is required.

> "Lift Jesus higher; lift Jesus higher; lift Him up for the world to see. He said, "If I be lifted up from the earth, I will draw all men unto Me."

Jesus said,

- "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up ... " (John 3:12-15)
- "When you have lifted up the Son of Man, then you will realize that I am He, and that I do nothing on my own, but I speak these things as the Father instructed me." (John 8:28)
- "I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself." ... The crowd answered Him, "We have heard from the law that the Messiah remains forever. How can you say that the Son of Man must be lifted up? Who is this Son of Man?" (John 12:32, 34)
- When Jesus had said this, as they were watching, He was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight. (Acts 1:9)

The word "exalt" has a very similar meaning to "lift up" – honour, worship, bow down to, obey willingly, declare "He is King of kings, and Lord of lords"; and so on.

Recently I have been looking at a series of 21 brief videos on various aspects of "Exalting Jesus" [See the end of this Update to find out how you can see these videos online]

Jesus came into this world as both Son of Man, and Son of God. His name is Jesus – our Saviour. He is our Teacher and example – He teaches us and shows us how we should live.

It is easier for us to understand what God is like when we see Him revealed as a person, as the Son of Man; as we hear what He said, and did, and taught. So, in exalting Jesus, we can easily picture Him as One who is to be exalted in different ways – many of which are mentioned and explained in the video series.

- We hear of the voices of angels exalting at Jesus' birth. (Luke 2:8-15)
- We see Jesus 'lifted up' as He came up from the water after His **baptism**, and the Spirit of God came upon Him like a dove, and a voice from Heaven said, "This is My beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:13-17)
- We see Him 'lifted up' at His transfiguration on the mountain. (Matthew 17:1-8)
- The people's worship at His **triumphal entry** into Jerusalem on a donkey. (Matthew 21:6-11; John 12:12-16)
- We see Him 'lifted up' on the cross; 'raised up' from the grave; 'lifted up' in His ascension to Heaven.
- We see Him exalted, sitting on the throne at the right hand of God (Revelation 5:1-14)

How do we exalt Jesus?

We exalt Jesus ...

By confessing that He is Lord. By our obedience. By our worship and praise. By serving Him. By our lives and witness. By our looking up to Him, honouring Him, loving Him, allowing our lives to be led by Him, ... and in many other ways!

"He is Lord! He is Lord! He is risen from the dead and He is Lord. Every knee shall bow, every tongue confess, that Jesus Christ is Lord."

PSALM 24

The earth is the LORD's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for He has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers.
